As the county's only dedicated program for the unhoused, we use grant funds to supply food, toiletries, blankets, sleeping bags, hotel stays, gas cards, and utility deposits as needed. Funding also supports access to IDs, birth certificates, and a mobile food and clothing closet that operates throughout the year.
